What a way to start the new year! We hope that you are all well, keeping safe and coping with all that this further lockdown has to offer.

School remains open to the children of key workers and vulnerable children. In the first lockdown, back in March 2020 we averaged around five children a day in school. This time it is more like the partial re-opening of schools before the Summer holidays and we have three bubbles of around 10 -12 children coming in every day. Because we need to keep these numbers to a safe

minimum - to protect the health of teachers, pupils and everyone in our community— we have had to put a limit on these places for the moment.

All of this means that parents, children and teachers are having to work differently and adapt to the idea of learning remotely. I want to personally thank all of the staff in our school who have worked hard throughout this national crisis. They have set up easy to follow routines to allow our children to continue their studies and maintain their progress. As I said in my blog message on Wednesday, it is very pleasing to look at the results of the tests we did in December and see that most of our children have caught up greatly since the September return and are working in line with expectations for their age. This is down to their positive attitude to learning and incredibly hard work. It is also down to the quality teaching they have received. But, let's not forget it is also because of the encouragement and dedication of all of our parents and guardians. You have kept an eye on their home learning, tested them on spellings, helped them with times tables and made sure they have been in school every day. Before Christmas, attendance remained above 96%, which is excellent. I want to acknowledge that and thank you all for your part in their very successful return to school.

So, now this momentum has been gained, it is vital that we do not allow it to slip. It is more important than ever that we make sure all of the children do the remote learning set for them by their teachers. Each day, there is a different set of tasks set on the pupil area for them to access and complete. We are making use of the nationally recognised Oak Academy, Prodigy and White Rose Maths websites to provide structured, fully explained learning on a par with that which they would receive in school. These tools will help your child maintain their progress this year and will continue the standard of education they have been receiving in school.

We know that it is not the same as being in class with their teacher. We know that they are missing the structure of coming to school everyday but be assured that we are doing as much as we can to make learning constructive, fun and most of all, as simple to access as possible.


Thank you for all you are doing at this time. Hopefully, we can return to normal service as soon as possible.

Writing Challenge

Lancaster City Council are administering the Emergency Assistance Grant Scheme within the District, this may be of use to some of you at this time.

The Local Authority Emergency Assistance Grant Scheme has been introduced to support people who are struggling to afford food and other essential items due to financial hardship caused by Covid-19. This scheme is temporary. The scheme can help with short-term living costs such as food, gas and electric, essential household appliances and school uniforms. Cash will not usually be awarded.

The eligibility for the scheme is:

- Aged 16 years or over
- A resident of the Lancaster City Council district
- Experiencing financial hardship as a direct result of Covid-19 and not have enough resources to meet your immediate short-term needs
- On a low income or in receipt of one of the following benefits:
- Universal Credit
- o Jobseeker's Allowance
- Employment Support Allowance
- o Income Support
- o Pension Credit
