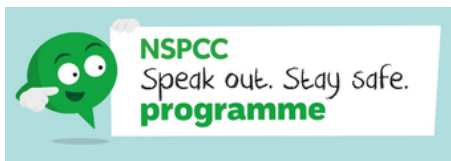
Rugby Coaching Class 2 and 3

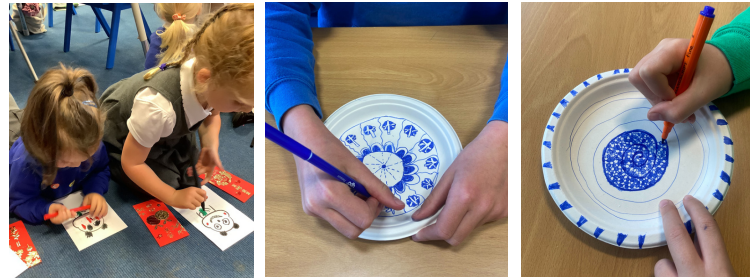

BLACK HISTORY MONTH



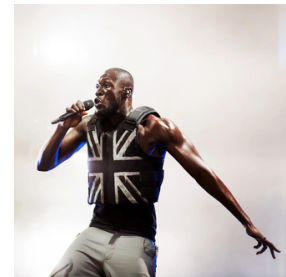
Archbishop Hutton's

October marks Black History Month across the UK. Originally conceived as a way to make some dedicated space for teaching, engaging with and celebrating Black history, the month now stands for something bigger: a celebration of Black lives, heritage and culture.

This year, we are going to be dedicating part of our learning time to learning about significant black British people, their contribution to life in Britain and their legacy. In assembly, the children will be learning about the Windrush generation, inspiring sports stars, musicians who have entertained us, giants of Science and STEM and pioneers of social justice. All of these people have made a unique and vital contribution to what Britain is today.



On the last week of term, we will be dedicating the week to in depth learning about significant people. We would like to invite parents to school on **Friday 20th October** to share our learning and find out more about some of the people we have been studying. We hope you will be available to attend.



There are thousands of significant Black British Icons. To prepare for Black History Week, we want the children to choose one (or more) from the list below. We want them to research the person and produce a poster or booklet about them.
