## Curious Investigators Show

What a treat we had on Tuesday 8th, when Class 1 and 2 were visited by the Curious Investigators who put on a science show for us. The interactive show was very informative and exciting and the cast were very impressed with the scientific questions the children asked based on the show.



In the afternoon, Class 2 had a follow up session with Dr. Wise, who is an engineer from Lancaster University. Dr. Wise led the children through an investigation looking at how eggs can be protected and safely moved. It was a really interesting afternoon. Next week, the children will link up with some expert engineers on a zoom call, where they get to ask them questions about their job.



## Class Four STEM Science Day

On Wednesday, Dr Wise from Lancaster University came to see us again, this time working with Class Four. The children learnt all about sustainability and how scientists try to mimic nature in order to create objects such as bike helmets and glues. They also learnt that crops can be grown upwards on walls as well as horizontally in fields and worked together to produce prototype plant growing and feeding systems.



## Year Six Playleaders

Over the past three weeks, Year Six have been working with a coach to develop their leadership skills. This structured program has helped them formulate games and learn how to engage others. Now, they have graduated as Play Leaders and have been playing leading games sessions at lunchtime.

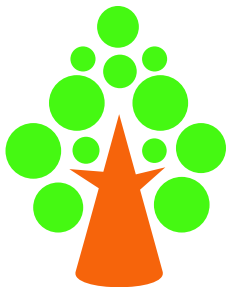


## DT - Cooking in Class Three
