Behaviour Policy

As a staff, we have been thinking it may be time to remind parents how our behaviour policy works.

Ready to Learn: Everyone starts the day and morning here. The aim is to stay here all day.



Think About It: Maybe I am not listening to instructions or I have done something I shouldn't have. (Talking when I should be working, not following instructions, being cheeky, rude or silly. My name moves to this zone as a reminder to stop. When I have stopped it goes back to **Ready to Learn**. THIS ZONE IS JUST A WARNING - PARENTS ARE NOT INFORMED IF A CHILD'S NAME IS IN THINK ABOUT IT.

Consequences: If I have carried on behaving in a challenging way, my name might be moved to this zone. This will result in me having to speak to the headteacher about my behaviour and attitude. I can expect to spend a playtime thinking about what I have done. I would automatically be in this zone if I swear, hurt someone else, break another's property or lose my temper. I CAN EXPECT MY PARENTS TO BE TOLD ABOUT THIS.

Role Model: When I do something special - helping someone, being an example to others, going above and beyond - I can be given a Role Model. My name is put in this zone and stays there all day. When I get 10 Role Models, I am Officially Amazing!
