I would automatically be in this zone if I swear, hurt someone else, break another's property or lose my temper. **I CAN EXPECT MY PARENTS TO BE TOLD ABOUT THIS.**

**Role Model:** When I do something special - helping someone, being an example to others, going above and beyond - I can be given a Role Model. My name is put in this zone and stays there all day. When I get 10 Role Models, I am Officially Amazing!
