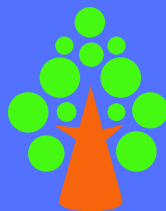

## Skipping Workshop

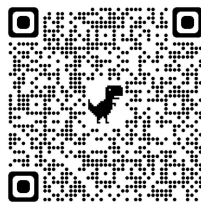
