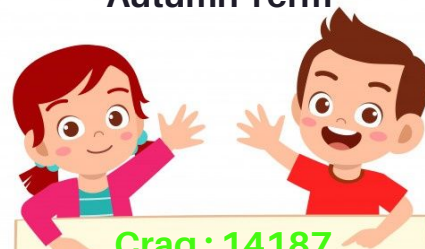

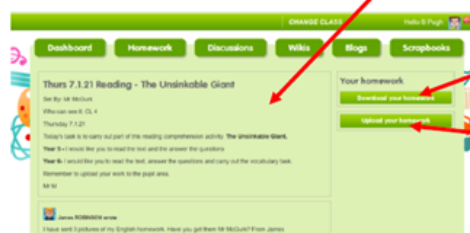


Next, click on View all Homework.
