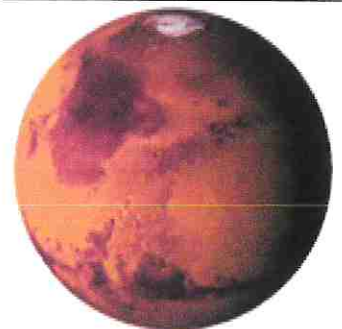

KEEP CALM AND CARRY ON

Well done to all the children, parents and staff for managing to keep calm and carry on this week! Parents should be proud of their children for the way they have continued to work hard and behave well in school.



Here is the Government's current guidance on whole household isolation in response to the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak:

- If you live alone and you have symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), however mild, stay at home for 7 days from when your symptoms started
- If you live with others and you or another member of the household have symptoms of coronavirus, then all household members must stay at home and not leave the house for 14 days. The 14-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill. It is likely that people living within a household will infect each other or be infected already. Staying at home for 14 days will greatly reduce the overall amount of infection the household could pass on to others in the community
- For anyone in the household who starts displaying symptoms, they need to stay at home for 7 days from when the symptoms appeared, regardless of what day they are on the original 14-day isolation

The symptoms are:

- a high temperature (37.8 degrees and above)
- a new continuous cough

Today's latest government guidance to schools and parents

- 1. If it is at all possible for children to be at home, then they should be.**
- 2. If a child needs specialist support, is vulnerable or has a parent who is a critical worker, then educational provision will be available for them.**
- 3. Parents should not rely for childcare upon those who are advised to be in the stringent social distancing category such as grandparents, friends, or family members with underlying conditions.**
- 4. Parents should also do everything they can to ensure children are not mixing socially in a way which can continue to spread the virus.**

They should observe the same social distancing principles as adults.

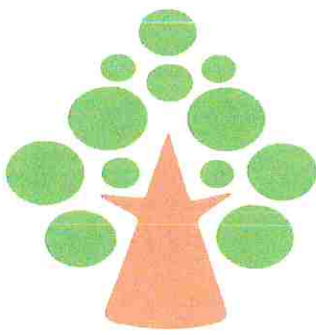
- 5. Residential special schools, boarding schools and special settings continue to care for children wherever possible.**
