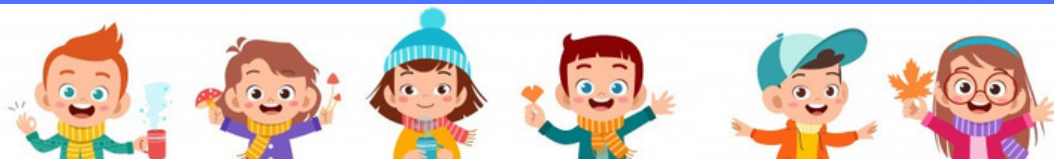

KEEPING US SAFE

We are working hard to look after the health of our community and so here is a summary of our current guidance for the start of term:

- Parents of children who are classed as medically vulnerable or who live in a household with an immunosuppressed adult are encouraged to contact their GP to discuss/arrange vaccination.
- If your child has Covid symptoms, however mild, keep them home and inform school; LFD (Lateral Flow) test.
- If your child tests positive on a LFD test, arrange a PCR test and isolate.
- Keep school informed if your child tests positive on a LFD or PCR test
- If your child is a close contact with a positive Covid case they must test negative on a LFD test each day before attending school.
- Mask wearing in classrooms is now mandatory for pupils and staff in high schools across the UK. Mask wearing in classrooms is optional for staff at Archbishop Hutton's - in line with other Primary Schools.
- On school premises, visitors must wear a mask and socially distance from those not in their household.

LATEST COVID ADVICE

From Monday 17th January, the self-isolation period will be reduced from 7 days to 5, however, this isn't as straightforward as it sounds, so please use the example below.

Day 0	Positive test or symptoms start (whichever happens first). This day isn't included when calculating your isolation period.
Day 1	Day 1 of your self-isolation period starts the next day after symptoms / positive test – again whichever happens first.
Day 5	Take LFT and continue to isolate. If it is negative, you can take another test 24 hours later on day six.
Day 6	Take a LFT and isolation ends if the test from day 5 and 6 are both negative.
