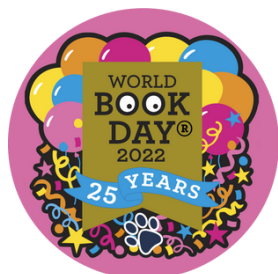

KEEPING US SAFE - COVID19

As you know, we have had quite a few children off with Covid19 before half term.

The government's current advice is: *Until 1st April, we will still advise people who test positive to stay at home.*

Here is our current guidance:

- Parents of children who are classed as medically vulnerable or who live in a household with an immunosuppressed adult are encouraged to contact their GP to discuss/arrange vaccination.
- If your child has Covid symptoms, however mild, keep them home and inform school; LFT (Lateral Flow) test. If positive they should self isolate.
- Keep school informed if your child tests positive on a LFD or PCR test
- If your child is a close contact with a positive Covid case we will let you know so you can monitor symptoms and test for Covid.
