- We are about to launch stage three of our Big IT drive. After the successful purchase of new computers for our computer room and a new server, the target is to raise money for new screens and teacher computers for the classrooms. The equipment we have in place currently is very outdated and has been in need of replacement for some time.

Our first fundraiser will be launched next week. Every child will be designing a Christmas picture. 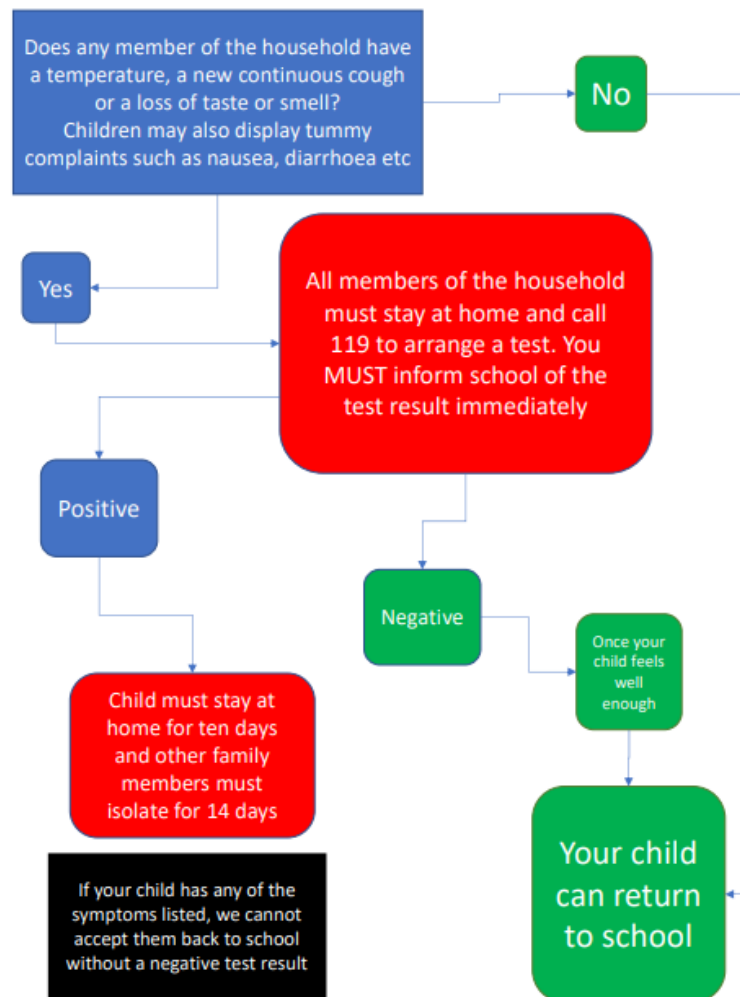
Later in the month, we will be holding a Sponsored Run to raise funds and to launch our brand new track. The company which makes the track are based near Derby which is 140 miles away.
